What is Dasvandh?

“Dasvandh” means “one tenth of.” As demonstrated by the Gurus, Sikhs use this concept to donate 10% of their earnings, time, and resources toward community improvement. Langar is one example of Dasvandh in action!

What is a Dasvandh Box?

A Dasvandh Box is a little box with a big meaning. It is meant to show the importance of giving back to others and that every little bit counts. By raising just a few pennies at a time, collectively, your Khalsa School can make a big difference! Dasvandh Network's [Dasvandh Box Initiative](#) is a program that consists of a lesson plan on Dasvandh, as well as a six-week trial of giving Dasvandh.

This program is designed to:

- ★ educate our Sikh children on the meaning of Dasvandh
- ★ be a rewarding experience in learning about the importance of Seva
- ★ encourage leadership
- ★ be easy to participate in
- ★ remind parents and children to inspire the act and spirit of Dasvandh

Program Duration

The program runs for six weeks at your Gurdwara/Khalsa School, whenever the Gurdwara management chooses.
